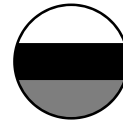

Chairman Pai's 5G FAST Plan, endorsed by the Trump Administration, calls for sharing the 1200 MHz in the 6 GHz band for uses like Wi-Fi. The plan is supported by the Chairman's colleagues, Republican and Democrat, as well as members of Congress. Sharing 6 GHz for unlicensed uses like Wi-Fi was an important position of the United States at the most recent International World Radio Conference (WRC19). International harmonization requires sharing 6 GHz on an unlicensed basis. There is no current proposal internationally to auction any part of the 6 GHz band for exclusive licensed use.
